

There are some things that I am always meticulous about. I was fussing over what I saw as a bare spot on the Christmas tree when I dropped and broke a glass ornament. My attention to detail for our worship folders can be frustrating to Joy, our administrative assistant, but even then, typos get through. Do I get angry? Of course not. No one is harmed if something is forgotten, or out of place. Few of us ever want to do a slapdash job, but if we get bent out of shape over our mistakes we might run into real trouble.

As we plan ahead, with a brand new calendar attached to the refrigerator with cute magnets, we need to enter all the events, vacations, and especially evening meetings that we have so that we can assign drivers, who will do what, and what overlapping items will be difficult to manage. It goes without saying that some plans will fall by the wayside when either something more important comes along, or an emergency stops us in our tracks. Also true is that we must keep in mind the bank balance and the credit cards that make these bigger events possible. Again the emergency car repair or doctor visit throws us for a loop. As we look ahead then in this new year, I hope our realities match our expectations.

As Yoda might say, cloudy the future is. It is foolish to think that everything will come out as we hoped. I'm not a prophet, but I have a very good guess that this will be another tumultuous year. Wars, another presidential election, and weather disasters are all unpredictable. We who trust in God would like to think that this might cause more people to embrace a faith stance that calls people to come together in the face of our divisions and conflicts. We preach peace against those things in our human nature that does not trust others. We offer love for one another when others look out only for themselves.

Do I know what to expect for Saint Peters in the coming year? I think we have to understand our limits, while at the same time concentrating our efforts on things that are meaningful and useful to our neighbors. More and more, I am so very grateful for the work that our school has done to keep on growing. It is making a difference that we have invited school families, using a little incentive, to attend worship. The only other goal that I would want us to plan for would be one or two events that serve the practical needs of our neighbors. I think people, especially young people, want to do things that make a difference. When we see people in trouble, and bad things happening, it's important to put our hands in the dirt, so to speak, so that lives are lifted up and even changed. I wonder if anyone has ever figured out how much Jesus spoke to people, teaching them things. and how often he helped his people, through healing and feeding. These were miracles, but I might guess they did some practical sharing of food and other resources to the poor and the outcasts who were his followers. After all we're not doing miracles, and yet we are committed to service for whatever need our neighbor may have. I always find a good Martin Luther quote helps us out, so here's this one: God does not need our good works, but our neighbors certainly do. A church, when we have praised God, prayed for our needs, and heard good news about God's grace and mercy, goes out into the world which Jesus has called our vineyard where God's servants go to work. We will always be strong enough because Jesus goes with us. You can expect and trust that this promise will be ours, as daily, we are given the chance to love as we've been loved.

A NOTE from YOUR CHOIR DIRECTOR

"What Child Is This?"

This was the surprise song we added to the third of Advent service as an answer to the question, "Why we are not singing Christmas carols during Advent, when everyone else does?" Pondering this when touched by the unhappiness of some of us about this practice I thought about how that could be answered without sacrificing the importance of the preparation that our scripture texts ask of us in order to welcome the prince of peace. Isaiah tells us: Prepare the way of the Lord; behold, the Lord comes with might. (Is 40,3,10).

I want to share a few words of the Christmas greeting my husband sent to the family:

He came: "A child is given to us"! We marvel over mother and child, over new birth, how the future continues, in spite of death and destruction. Awe and humility, song and adoration are the response. Yes, we are not there yet, but we are on the way. If you are stuck in the mud: look beyond and wait with hope but dare to take the next step. Without Advent Christmas loses "the child born in a manger". Stuck in the mud? Just celebrate! The celebration, while you are engaged, will give meaning. You might be surprised. God surprised the world, and we are still celebrating.

What child is this, who, laid to rest, on Mary's lap is sleeping?
Whom angels greet with anthems sweet while shepherds watch are keeping?
This, this is Christ the king, whom shepherds guard and angels sing; Haste, haste to bring him laud, the babe, the son of Mary. (ELW 296)

I think that celebrating while waiting with hope is a good start also for the new year. May God bless our celebration as we are here for each other.
