FORWARD

I wrote this to the group on Facebook where we rostered leaders share information and opinions. Sometimes we ask questions and this was mine: what shall we do when we have enough new people attending worship who don't know the songs or hymns that are part of our repertoire? We've introduced new music by using the idea of the hymn of the month. When we repeat something often enough that helps make it something we become familiar with. What I am looking for are songs that are an entryway into singing together when that isn't something but we do regularly any longer. At the contemporary service, school families have accepted our invitation to attend church, and have their kids in Sunday school, so that it looks different during that hour. What we've been doing for the last 10 years may not be accessible to new families. I was very glad when one of our neighboring colleagues give me a list of songs both from the contemporary music library, but also the camp songs that I've grown to love. That may give us a good head start on helping us all to participate together in the praise of our God.

There are other things we have to think about as we move into the future. People come and go; families who found our school have in the past become a big part of our working together. I hope this continues. People retire and make their way to sunnier climates; no one can blame them when winter ice and snow bogs us down. Then we have also said goodbye to our faithful departed: that is one change that we can't stop. We are relying on new and different people to be a part of the mission and leadership of our congregation. That has always been true, whether we have moved forward, or people have taken exception to how things have – and here's that scary word again - how things have **changed**. But there is only one alternative to growing, and that is the end of the life of a church or a person.

So I have a question which I can't necessarily answer. I may have shared it in different situations because we may not look at it as often as we should. It is, 'how are we preparing to be the Church of the future?' Some of it may be obvious; we've been told for a long time that we should make worship user friendly. Churches today use technology as best as they know how to present worship in a way that seems like what we may experience in daily life. Worship folders with clean and attractive print from a computer replace hand-typed mimeographs. Hymns and songs are printed in that worship folder. But then slide shows projected on the screen have replaced those bulletins. Preaching and teaching have changed to meet the needs of children and families who don't have the same background or knowledge that we lifelong Christians have. As much as we try to hold on to our traditions and practices, Sunday morning in a church is a lot different than it used to be. It may be upsetting, but things move forward or they stop.

There is good news: Not everything that we used to do has to be, or should be, replaced. Language may be updated for hymns and scriptures, but we can use the older versions of the Lord's Prayer and the 23rd Psalm whose poetry has sunk deep into our hearts. Hymns retain their beauty when we agree that the old English just sounds right. There are two words whose concepts help us in this way: being *inclusive*, and being expansive. People may think inclusivity is all about accommodation. It is about respect and welcome, because after all, we are made in God's image – all of us. Being expansive means that we are adding things; we don't have to subtract. As I said, we're not replacing anything; we are bringing more and different ideas and ways of doing things to the work that we do in an ever changing world.

But we at Saint Peters have to make this work for ourselves. Even though I've been here a long time, and I have done things differently than before, you are still the ones who will carry it forward. New people, who are not our relatives, are here; they have been added to those who have been here a long time. Some of you have sent your family members to other parts of our land. This is the church family we have

for now, and for the future. And while I am here, I will ask the question that Dietrich Bonhoeffer posed to a church in deep crisis in World War II Germany: how shall we be the church for others? The future belongs to others; we will be a part of it, then we will go home to our God and the eternal rest of peace. The Church, the body of Christ, will go on, and grow, as Spirit makes it happen.
