PEACE

Being in church is an extraordinary thing. We can tell that right from the beginning, when we start the confession and forgiveness asking God to be with us. We may use God's name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Or we may use how the church has described God, as the Holy Trinity. Then we have the audacity to ask God to forgive our sins. And we do that without even offering any sort of sacrifice, because we've been told that Jesus did that once and for all on the cross. Sometimes worship has been called our sacrifice of praise, because after all we are submitting ourselves to God's rule over us. And any stewardship drive from church leadership will ask us, as individuals and as a congregation, to consider sacrificial giving you can guess that that means more than a couple of folded up bills in the plate.

Then comes the other extraordinary thing that we do the beginning of worship, and that is to greet one another. But it isn't just 'hello', or 'it's nice to see you', or 'welcome!' The classic greeting is from the scriptures: Paul's first letter to the Church at Corinth, "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit is with you all." As you well know from attending worship, I have a tendency to write a bunch of different greetings either directly from the Bible or by using biblical qualities: joy, hope, mercy, and the like.

The preeminent greeting that the Church gave, but which extends well past when Jesus used it to the earliest times of the people of Israel, is **peace**. It was the common greeting of one believer to another, whether Christian or Jewish. Jesus would have used the Hebrew word, Shalom. Even when Aramaic was their primary language, I'd have to think that Jesus and his disciples would use the term that was a constant in the synagogue. Along came other peoples: the Greek for peace is **εἰρήνη**, and can be pronounced *i-ray'-nay*,

and you've seen me use the Latin in all my messages and newsletter columns: *pax*.

Peace is the greeting Jesus gives to his disciples when he appears to them after having risen from the dead. It sounds very consequential, because the boundary between life and death has been broken in Jesus resurrection. The word Shalom has carried a great weight even if it is a simple daily greeting. Peace, as used in our common language, means being calm, having contentment and tranquility, or the absence of war and violence. It certainly means the same in a faith community, but also expresses a deeper idea. Peace means wholeness, completeness – it is the fullness of experience that we humans have. Though we have conflicts and struggles, peace means that we are able to take it in, and not succumb to the negative feelings of tension and strife. Peace is given as a gift of Spirit, and as such, can be more meaningful than when we are merely content with how things are.

Peace in our worship becomes the greeting when we are going to approach the altar for Holy Communion. We receive these gifts in the body and blood of Christ: forgiveness and strength. Almost always we'll have the rite of confession that prepares us for the eucharist. But the act of remembering and honoring the gift of Jesus' life in the meal also gives us absolution for our sins. Since we are receiving all the grace and mercy Jesus wants for his followers, then we are blessed with peace and wholeness. And so it stands that we also have the strength and compassion to act on that gift by loving, forgiving and serving others. So, as I often say to the children in chapel on Wednesdays, is that enough? It sure is. Amen

A NOTE from YOUR CHOIR DIRECTOR

At Holly's and Sean's wedding last Saturday many of us heard Martha's community choir sing: "... may you always have a song!" What a beautiful invitation to give voice to the things that matter to us, whether sad or joyful, in despair or rejoicing, singing brings us together, sharing words of lament or praise and thanksgiving during this time of preparation for Easter, still walking through the season of Lent.

Walking together – what that means, a favorite Easter story of mine can illustrate: two disciples of Jesus walk together to Emmaus, they are walking home, disappointed and full of pain, because their hope of their master bringing them freedom has been dashed by his brutal death as that of a criminal. They walk away from him whom they experienced as teacher, healer and the one who called himself the way, the truth and the life (John 14:6). But they do not stay alone, someone joins them on their walk, explaining God's ways to them so that they feel strangely encouraged and invite the stranger to stay. He does and as they share supper, and he breaks the bread they recognize Jesus. Recognizing the life, they also recognize the truth and the way - and they turn back to Jerusalem to the others who also experienced Jesus alive.

One of our Easter hymns describes beautifully that it is God, who promised in the Old Testament reading we heard this morning in church "that he would make a new covenant with his people where he would write his law on their heart and they would know him," and that it is in worshipping together that our faith is renewed and we keep returning to the one who gives us life.

Here are the words of one of our contemporary hymn writers I cherish, Susan Palo Cherwien's hymn "Day of Arising" ELW 374:

Day of arising, Christ on the roadway, unknown companion walks with his own. When they invite him, as fades the first day, and bread is broken, Christ is made known.

When we are walking, doubtful and dreading, blinded by sadness, slowness of heart, yet Christ walks with us, ever awaiting our invitation: Stay, do not part.

Lo, I am with you, Jesus has spoken.
This is Christ's promise, this is Christ's sign:
when the church gathers,
when bread is broken,
there Christ is with us in bread and wine.

Christ, our companion, hope for the journey, bread of compassion, open our eyes.
Grant us your vision, set all hearts burning that all creation with you may rise.
