# **CHANGE OF HEART**

When we get toward the end of the year, both the last few Sundays of our time with Luke **and** the beginning of Advent, we are drawn to the end of all things. Even John the Baptist sees beyond what he looks for in the appearance of a mightier One who is coming, to what God is doing by breaking into the world to bring all things back to God's final purpose. God is making all things new, and while that is often played on the grand canvas of the history that is awaiting us, there are many small ways that God's will is fulfilled for creation, for humanity. We may see things coming apart, what science calls entropy, but committed and faithful people are also working towards the divine healing that this world and its people need. We are warned of the future that is upon us when apostles and prophets proclaim: the Lord is near. The court jester than calls out: you better look busy!

But we can also take to heart, amidst our fears, that God is near, Jesus is near, in a very intimate way. It may not always be clear, it may seem more like a promise than a reality, but it is also a simple idea. We can pray. We can read God's word and study it together. We can share in worship, both what is simple and honest, or what is grand, and delightful to the senses of sight, sound, touch, and even smell – I like it when incense is a part of a high festival liturgy at one of our city churches. Then there is the bread and wine, Christ's body and blood, where we can say we are what we eat. And Spirit (I like to think of this as a name as well as a *title*) presents us with times of mystery and wonder: a dream, a sensation, a glimpse of beauty, a bold confidence in God's presence wherever we are and especially when we are together.

As God is near us in these ways, both mundane and sublime, we are changed. I've quoted my teacher often enough that you may well know this thought: if we're not moved in some manner by listening to someone, then

we haven't really listened. You have to think that whenever God speaks, things are changed. Yet prophets still go about the business of reminding us of God's word to the world, for the story of God's people from the written word to the history we've known shows that we've rebelled, refused to act on what we've heard. Yes, the seed will fall on shallow ground and has no chance to establish strong roots. But Isaiah also told God's promise that the word will not return to its source without doing what God purposed for it. We can be grateful for God's time, and a patience God has that we cannot comprehend. The Lord is near. We can see it, and yet we can't. Habakkuk said this, which we repeated for many weeks this autumn, to keep us constantly alert:

There is still a vision for the appointed time;

it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay.

We know this counsel by heart from Paul, how he states with conviction and confidence that the Lord is near, so that we trust what we know and what we will do: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

# A NOTE from YOUR CHOIR DIRECTOR

There are two words I learned in therapy for meditation that I use to calm down at any time and in any situation. One is "Breathe." When I focus on my breathing, and notice my breath coming in and out, other thoughts will quiet down and move to the background. The other word is "Allow." Allow what you are feeling, whether it is comfort, irritation, boredom, excitement, even pain, allow it to be there — no judgement — and breathe.

It also helps when I find a focus that takes me away from my worries or anxieties. When I jump in the car to go to work, shop or have to attend to a task, I am greeted by the music from the classical music station and immediately feel more settled. Add to that the music of a favorite song and I am ready to tackle what comes next.

We have a great songbook in the Bible called the Psalms – and when you can sing the words rather than just recite them, they have the potential of becoming a mantra in distress. That's what happens to me when I remember a motet I learned in school of Psalm 71: "In you, O Lord, have I taken refuge." Turning away from what troubles us and turning to God, who is our refuge, becomes a source of strength and gives us courage to breathe, to allow, and to go forth doing.

Last Sunday we sang a hymn that gives us such a beacon to go forward. Let me close with its entirety:

If you but trust in God to guide you with gentle hand through all your ways, you'll find that God is there beside you when crosses come, in trying days.

Trust then in God's unchanging love; build on the rock that will not move.
